The angel of the Lord appeared to Manoah's wife and said, "Even though you have been unable to have children, you will soon become pregnant and give birth to a son ... and his hair must never be cut.

Judges 13:3-5, NLT

As I write this, it's been three months since my last haircut. By the time you read this, however, I should have been able to get one. It's amazing how excited we can get about relatively minor things.

Having longer hair has reminded me of how we wore our hair in the 60s and 70s. Even now, I'm looking at my high school senior picture. My hair is pretty long. Of course, it's a little obscured by my leisure suit, but that's another matter altogether! As my hair has gotten longer, I've also felt this sense of a connection to Samson. Okay, now that you've finished laughing, it's not because of my amazing strength: no one is going to make that mistake. It's just made me think about living with long hair and that makes me think of Samson.

Samson is an interesting character in scripture. God blesses him. God gives him gifts. God enables him to accomplish tremendous works for Israel. But ultimately Samson takes it for granted and his story ends up being one of the saddest in the Old Testament.

It strikes me that we are kind of in a Samson-like moment. Prior to the pandemic, I suspect that most of us took many things for granted—our ability to enter any store at any time, the freedom to get a haircut and to visit with each other face to face, our ability to gather together for worship. Now that we are able to do a few things that we weren't the last few months, now that we are making plans to come back together for worship, now that we can begin to see some light at the end of this tunnel, the temptation is to forget some of the lessons we've learned and to simply go back to taking our blessings for granted.

One of the ways in which we might find help for falling back into unhealthy perspectives about God's gifts is to remember so many in the world who not only experienced far worse circumstances then we but whose lives before the pandemic were extremely difficult. What we have gone through as Christians is only a glimpse of what so many of our brothers and sisters live with continually. What helps my perspective is that so often is that even as Christians in difficult places pray for relief they're also giving thanks that despite their circumstances they know that God is good, that God is with them and that God is greater and their circumstances. I want to know that kind of life in Christ. My prayer is that all of us will know that kind of life in Christ—the kind of life that the Apostle Paul, writing from a prison in chains, speaks of in his letter to the Philippians: "Always be full of joy in the Lord. I say it again—rejoice (4:4).

A children's ministry of the Houghton Wesleyan Church, RFKC continues to be grateful as we move toward our 26th summer of showing Christ's Love to 52 children from our local area who have suffered multiple Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) including neglect, abuse and abandonment.*

This year, the RFKC experience will be a bit different. Instead of a residential five-day camp in July, our volunteers will be bringing camp to our campers. During the first week of August, a *Royal Family on Parade* consisting of three caravans of volunteers bringing music, signs, ice cream, bubbles and more will be driving throughout Allegany County (and four surrounding counties) delivering "Camp in a Box" to our campers. Each camper will get a Bibles and activity book, MP3 music player, t-shirt, "Every Kids' Birthday" dinner and gifts, and a memory book filled with *heart notes* of encouragement and love.

During the past two months, we have worked with the Department of Social Services and the campers' guardians to let them know that they are not forgotten. 

The Allegany County Office for the Aging will be handing out the 2020 Farmer's Market Coupon booklets to eligible seniors at scheduled "drive-thru" distributions across the County.

The Farmers Market Coupon booklets will contain \$20 in Farmers Markets coupons for you to use at participating Farmers Markets. Please wear a face covering and remain in your vehicle to ensure proper social distancing.

Eligibility

- age 60 or over; have not received the coupons this year and meet the gross monthly income limits below:

\$1968/month for a one-person household; or \$2658/month for a two-person household; or \$3349/month for a three-person household

(Income levels increase by \$691/month based on the number of persons in the applicant's household)

All individuals age 60 and over in a household who meet income requirements are eligible to receive a Farmers Market coupon booklet. For more information contact the Office for the Aging (268-9390 or toll free 866-268-9390)
