CHRISTMAS EVE STREAMING SERVICE: Due to the continuing rise of Covid-19 cases in our area, we will not be gathering for Christmas Eve Services in the building this year. CHRISTMAS EVE GREETING: For the streaming preservice, we are creating a collage of greetings to and from each other. CHRISTMAS EVE OUTDOOR SERVICE: In addition to the full streamed service, we are going to gather outdoors at 5:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve for an abbreviated (about 30 minutes) service. We will sing carols, read scripture, hear a homily and light candles. We will also decorate with luminaries and have a living nativity.

CHRISTMAS EVE OFFERING: Every year our church receives a generous offering at Christmas for mission outreach. This year’s project is for Houghton Academy’s international student boarding program which has suffered COVID-19 setbacks.
